November 27 Exclusion: The target feels left out

November 27Put-downs: The target feels bad or hurt

November 28 Unwanted Physical Contact- boundaries

November 29Bullying: The target feels afraid*

November 30 Acts against everyone: The entire campus or large portions of it are affected

Through advisory we will explore these five areas. By identifying the specific ways in which students can be emotionally and or physically hurt, students can then be empowered with strategies for

stopping and minimizing the mistreatment of others. Working with students to identify the five types of mistreatment and teaching them ways to peacefully resolve conflict takes them from being a bystander to being a problem solver/upstander. Have your kids talk to you about the 5 areas and about our optional activity: David's Pledge and sticker campaign led by our Student Council & 6th Grade Service Club.
