<u>STAAR Testing</u>: Please mark your calendars. Please note: The campus will be closed to all visitors on these days (even if your child is not testing).

- Tuesday, 10 April: all 7th grade students will take the Writing Test 8th Grade students will take the Reading Test
- Wednesday, 11 April, all 7th grade Pre-AP math students and 8th grade Pre-Algebra students will take the 8th grade Math Test. All 8th grade Algebra Students will have a late entry on this day. If Algebra students would like to eat lunch at school they need to report by 1:10, if not, students need to report by 2:15 to proceed to 8th and 9th period. Girls Track: On Thursday the 7th and 8th grade Lady Mules competed in a track meet at Lehnhoff Stadium. The 7th grade relay teams place 1st in the 4x2 and 4x4 and 2nd in the 4x1. As well as, Victoria Baker and Meredith Perkins placing in the top 3 of their respected field events. There were great performances from AnnaBeth Tipton in the 400m dash and the 8th grade girls. Overall it was a great night for the track teams. Go Mules Go! Next week are the Prelims for the district meet.

Boys Track: Last night the Junior School Boys traveled to Lehnhoff Stadium to compete in their last practice meet of the year. 7th grade boys earned 3rd place overall and our 8th grade boys earned 5th. Ethan Ball raced himself to a 2nd place finish in the 400 M dash barely missing first overall. Gary Mejia glided to a 2nd place finish in the 100 M hurdles and 1st in the 300 M Hurdles. In the High Jump Ethan Ball and Rett Andersen tied for 1st while Warren Lawrence earned 4th taking 3 of the top 6 spots. Manny Harris, Ethan Ball, Corbin Gunter, and Harrison Sobey ran the best time of the year so far in the 4x400 relay, finishing 2nd overall. ENROLLMENT VERIFICATION Each year all AHISD parents are required to verify their child's enrollment through the Home Access Center (HAC) portal.

If you currently have a child attending school in the district, this is your opportunity to make changes to your child's personal information, as well as, sign the Student Code of Conduct, media release and other annually required documents. <u>Please make sure all of your contact information is up-to-date including ALL emergency contacts for your child.</u>

The deadline to complete the "Enrollment Verification" process is Tuesday, May 1, 2018.

You will need your Home Access Center (HAC) account username and password to complete this process. If you have forgotten your username and password for HAC, click the "Forgot my Username or Password" button on the HAC home screen. This <u>FAQ</u> document may help answer any questions you may have. If you have any problems, please do not hesitate to contact your child's campus for assistance. It is our goal to make this as easy as possible for you.
