**Girls Track:** On Thursday April 19<sup>th</sup> the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade Lady Mules competed in District Finals track meet at Canyon High School Stadium. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade team finished 4<sup>th</sup> place out of 10 schools overall, scoring 78 points. The 4X100 relay team placed 4<sup>th</sup>,The 4x200 m relay finished 2<sup>nd</sup>,The 4x400 m relay placed 5<sup>th</sup> place. The deadline to complete the "Enrollment Verification" process is Tuesday, May 1, 2018. You will need your Home Access Center (HAC) account username and password to complete this process. If you have forgotten your username and password for HAC, click the "Forgot my Username or Password" button on the HAC home screen. This FAQ document may help answer any questions you may have.
