Art Class Expectations

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Rules:

- **1.** Bring a sketchbook, a pencil, & an eraser to class every day.
- 2. Arrive to class on time. (See Attendance)
- **3.** Stay on task & do not disrupt other students' opportunity to learn.
- **4.** If you make a mess, take ownership & clean it up. When it is "cleanup-time", everyone must work together to clean up the art room.
- 5. Respect the teacher, respect each other, & respect boundaries.

Attendance:

Tardiness

If you arrive to class after the tardy bell, you must have a note from either the office or a teacher to be counted present. Tardiness is disruptive, so try to avoid it. (See the AHJS Student Handbook for possible consequences).

Absence

If you are absent and need extra time to complete your artwork, please speak with Mr. Fallis to request an extension/new due date. Late work must be done outside of class time to prevent further project delays.

Late Work:

Assignments that are not turned in when due will be graded as a "Zero." When the assignment is turned in late, 20 points will be subtracted as a penalty. Assignments turned in five days after a due date will receive a grade no higher than 70. Late work will not be accepted after a grading period is over. Deadlines have been created to teach students time management skills and accountability. If you require additional time to complete an assignment and have been <u>on task</u> during class time, speak with Mr. Fallis to request an extension.

Grading:

Grades will be determined by the following rubric:

0 = No effort was made to do the assignment.

F = All criteria and required elements for the assignment were not met and/or were not able to be seen due to careless execution.

C= All criteria and required elements for the assignment were met, but the student showed little effort to provide a finished product.

B= All criteria and required elements for the assignment were met and the student showed some effort to provide a finished product, but did not attempt to go beyond the creative boundaries of the assignment. There is much to be improved.

A= All criteria and required elements for the assignment were met and the student provided a finished product with little or nothing left to improve. The student created a finished product that challenged the boundaries of the assignment and showed personal creative decisions.

Always give your best effort, pay attention to instruction, and have a positive attitude. You will be successful, and you will be a better artist!
