Tutoring (arranged between teachers and students)

All students will be dismissed at 3PM and will report to their designated area:

- *Bus riders and students needing to go to study hall will go to the Auditorium*
- *Tutoring students will go to their designated area*
- *Car riders and walkers with no scheduled opportunity block appointments leave campus at 3PM*

Bus riders and opportunity block students will be dismissed at 4PM

Late bus services are Monday-Thursday. The buses leave the Junior School at 5PM.
